Garter stitch: knit every row Garter st

grams inc increase k knit

knit two stitches together: if these are the very last in the k2tog

row, then work together through back loop(s)

k3tog knit three stitches together

k-wise knitwise LH left hand

make one stitch: pick up horizontal loop between the ml

needles and work into the back of it

millimeters mm patt pattern purl p

purl two stitches together: if these stitches are the very first p2tog

in the row, then work together through back loop(s)

p3tog purl three stitches together

p-wise purlwise rem remaining rep repeat RH right hand RS right side

slk slip one stitch knitwise slp slip one stitch purlwise

St st Stockinette stitch: knit on the right side, purl on the

(1) SUPER FINE	Sock, fingering, baby	27–32 sts	1–3/2.25–3.25mm
E INE	Sport, baby	23–26 sts	3–5/3.25–3.75mm
IIGHT S	DK, light worsted	21–24 sts	5–7/3.75–4.5mm
4 medium	Worsted, afghan, aran	16-20 sts	7–9/4.5–5.5mm
EULKY BULKY	Chunky, craft, rug	12–15 sts	9–11/5.5–8mm
© 6 SUPER BULKY	Bulky, roving	6–11 sts	11 and larger/8mm and larger
